

The camp was received with great enthusiasm by students and staff alike, and it reflected the school's ongoing commitment to the holistic well-being of its students.





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

OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE IN NELTAS EXAMINATION 2024–25

Fostering Language Excellence and Academic Brilliance

Dr. Mar Theophilus School takes great pride in the impressive performance of its students in the NELTAS (National English Language Testing Assessment System) for the academic year 2024–25. This exam, which assesses students' proficiency in English language skills, including reading comprehension, grammar, vocabulary, and writing, saw enthusiastic participation from across the school.

A total of 345 students registered for the examination. Their performance has brought recognition to the school at the national level:

- 2 students secured the All-India 3rd Rank, bringing great pride and recognition to the school at the national level.
- 1 student was declared a Super Performer, an accolade awarded to top scorers demonstrating exceptional mastery across all sections.
