


Our pre-primary students had a blast in music class! They sang, danced, and played instruments, exploring the joy of music.

Children pasted the heart cutouts on the ice-cream sticks. Pasting is fun and develops the fine motor skills.


Cutouts of the specific colour can be an effective way to create visual differentiation in children.
