YOUTH THROUGH NUTRITIONAL LITERACY

As part of the Health and Wellness Month observed from 15th June to 15th July 2025, Dr. Mar Theophilus School organized a series of engaging and educational activities to promote nutritional awareness, diabetes prevention, and healthy lifestyle habits among students.

1) PowerPoint Presentation on Type 2 Diabetes Awareness

On 1st July 2025, students of Classes IX and X presented an informative PowerPoint presentation on Type 2 diabetes. The presentation aimed to raise awareness about the causes, symptoms, and growing prevalence of the disease among teenagers. Through easy-to-understand visuals and real-life examples, the presentation emphasized the importance of early detection, balanced diet, physical activity, and lifestyle changes. A special segment explained prediabetes, the organs affected, and global vs. Indian trends using a comparative graph.

The presentation concluded with a motivational message: "Healthy living is a journey, start yours today."

2) Activity on Reading Nutritional Labels

Students of Classes VI to IX participated in an interactive activity aimed at improving nutritional literacy. They were instructed to bring packaged food items from home—such as snacks, drinks, or ready-to-eat meals—and analyze nutritional labels. Students focused on reading and interpreting:

Total fat, saturated fat, and trans fat Sugar and sodium content Protein and dietary fiber Ingredient list

They then reflected on whether their chosen items were healthy, and whether they would continue eating them or look for alternatives. The activity encouraged mindful eating habits and a greater awareness of food choices.


18 JULY – A FLAVOURFUL FEAST: CELEBRATING MAHARASHTRIAN CUISINE WITH GRADES 1 & 2

Project CACA (Children Against Child Abuse) is a pioneering school-driven initiative that aims to instill a preventive, rights-based safety culture among children. The program integrates child rights education, moral development, and life skills into the school curriculum, promoting a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment for every learner.

The webinar began with an introduction to Project CACA and its vision for empowering schools with a structured child safety framework. It focused on the four fundamental child rights — protection, participation, development, and education — and emphasized the school's role in upholding these rights in daily practices. A compelling session on moral development helped educators understand the psychological stages children go through and how to nurture ethical thinking through regular classroom interactions. The importance of gender sensitivity and equality was also highlighted, encouraging the use of inclusive language and equitable classroom dynamics.

A major highlight of the session was the emphasis on the Ten Life Skills recommended by WHO — ranging from empathy and communication to critical thinking and emotional regulation. These were presented as foundational tools in helping children navigate real-life situations safely and confidently.

The webinar also introduced the CACA Workbooks — engaging, age-appropriate learning materials filled with real-life situations that prompt reflection, discussion, and awareness. These books not only address issues like personal safety and peer pressure but are also aligned with UNESCO's ten core values, making them valuable

resources in shaping holistic learners. The session concluded with renewed awareness and a shared vision: to nurture students not only academically, but also emotionally and socially — preparing them to lead safe, respectful, and responsible lives.


